Funding Opportunities:

- **Cornwall Climate & Nature Fund**, This grant sources match funding to a Crowdfunder Campaign for businesses.
This funding supports projects that will help Cornwall tackle and respond to climate change and promote nature recovery. If your idea or project meets the criteria you can apply for a grant to match fund up to 50% of costs, up to £5,000 - for exceptional projects that could offer a larger impact, we may offer grants of up to £15,000. **Applications accepted on an ongoing basis.**
- **Government Workplace Charging Grant**. The most recent round closed at midnight on 31st March 2027, but keep an eye out for further opportunities.
- **Carshare Cornwall**. Go onto the website add your journey, ask to share. You can split costs and it saves you money and cuts global energy consumption.

Training Opportunities:

- **The Carbon Literacy Project**. This page lists a whole range of climate literacy courses, some sectoral, some geographically based.
- **University of Plymouth Net Zero & Climate Change Workshop**.
- **Climate Skills through Creativity** – is a local course with free spaces available. Climate Vision is offering fully funded spaces on their Climate Skills through Creativity programme for Cornwall-based businesses and individuals. This course is designed to bring everyone up to speed on climate challenges, resilience strategies, and innovative solutions.
